There is a lot we still don't know about how the different chemicals in "bath salts" affect the brain. Researchers do know what bath salts are chemically similar to amphetamines, cocaine, and MDMA. Therefore, some of the effects of "baths salts" such as feeling energetic and agitated are similar.

Heroin often contains additives, such as sugar, starch, or powdered milk, that can clog blood vessels lead into the lungs, liver, kidneys, or brain, causing permanent damage.

Also, sharing drug injection equipment and having impaired judgment from drug use can increase the risk of contracting infectious disease such as HIV and hepatitis (see "Injection Drug Use, HIV, and Hepatitis").
